The safe area is shown here ->






It is necessary for the logo to have a minimum recommended size. In printed collateral Gallery of Photography Ireland logo should not be used smaller than 10mm high.



When used on its own, **P** mark should not be used smaller than 16 mm high.

Animated logo mark is created to emphasise dynamic, and ever changing programme and work by the Photo Museum Ireland.

Colfax is a refined oval sans serif. The conventionally round or semi-oval characters are made of subtle straight sides and near perfect circles – a kind of implied geometry, neither measured nor automated.

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
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Core Colours




Black and White — primary colours should be used for all internal Gallery communications.

Black and White — should be used as primary colours for collaborative projects with artists and other organisations, in which instance a secondary accent colour can be used.

Secondary Colours

A secondary colour should be used as accent colour only. It should never be used in large flat areas/backgrounds. The accent colour should be chosen from the original artwork, or to emphasise the tone of voice, keeping in mind that this colour has high contrast and strong visability when used with primary colours.
